Supporting our Members @ Provincial/National Competitions (Outside the Lower Mainland)

CMFSC has developed; over it's history, a commitment to excellence. This commitment lives in the players, families and coaches (many of who are volunteers), and is critical to our success in placing teams in provincial and national competitions. CMFSC teams' participation in such events helps build the club's brand, attracts new members and inspires others to not only participate, but to excel in the game. The success of these teams at the provincial and national level also provides opportunities for advancement, ultimately supporting our desire to have our players, coaches, officials, volunteers and staff aspire to the highest levels of the game.

Under a "player first" set of guiding principles, our support allows players and families to focus on the competition, as opposed to fundraising. Travel to provincial and national events often incurs loss of time from work and other activities that we cannot compensate our coaches, but we need to recognize that most of our coaches are volunteers and others are receiving a nominal stipend for their time.

Recognizing the commitment and the investment of these teams, as well as the positive outcomes that reflect on the club as a whole, it is important that we establish guidelines for financially supporting their success at provincial or national championships.

- 1. Additional technical support will be provided by staff coaches travelling with the teams to national competitions; whose out of pocket expenses will be provided by the club. These staff coaches will not only support our teams, but also represent our club at official events and meetings, as required.
- 2. The club will provide advance logistic and planning support (i.e. travel and accommodations booking) to teams and officials.
- 3. The club may also provide on-site logistic support, where more than 3 teams are travelling to one event.
